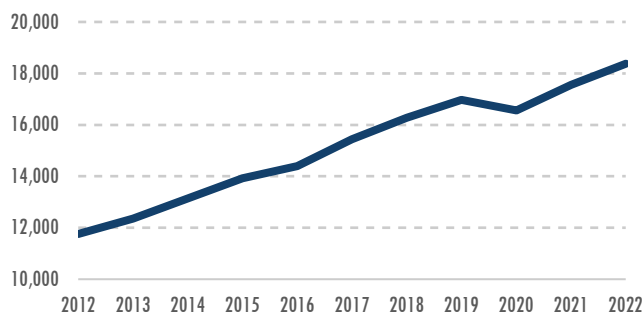


### Physical Therapists Growth Trends

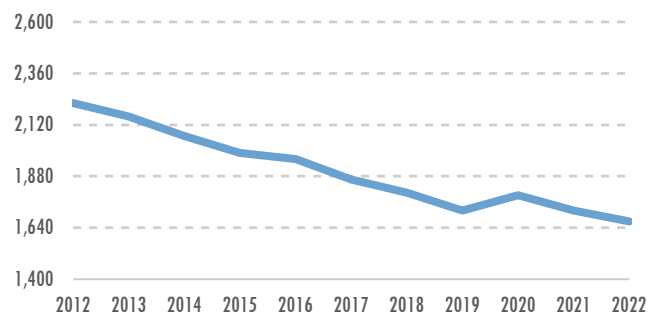
This fact sheet is an overview of the trends, distribution, and demographics of physical therapists in Texas. In 2022, there were 18,378 actively licensed physical therapists in Texas.

- This number represented a 19.0% increase since 2017 and a 56.2% increase since 2012 (Figure 1).

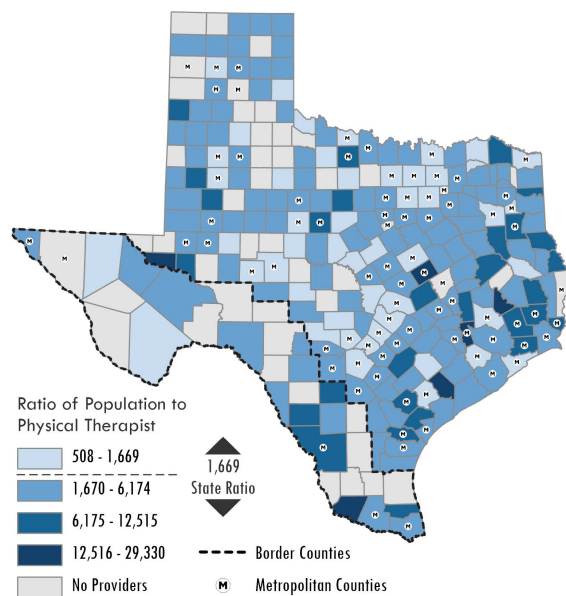


**Figure 2. Ratio of Texas Population to Physical Therapist<sup>1</sup>**

- The ratio of Texas population per one physical therapist in 2012 was 2,222:1 and in 2022 it was 1,699:1. The ratio of population to physical therapist has decreased by 24.9% (Figure 2).<sup>1</sup>

**Figure 1. Total Texas Physical Therapists**

- The ratio of the Texas population to one physical therapist was higher in non-metropolitan counties compared to metropolitan counties.
- The ratio of the Texas population to one physical therapist was higher in border counties compared to non-border counties.
- 45 counties had no physical therapists (Figure 3).

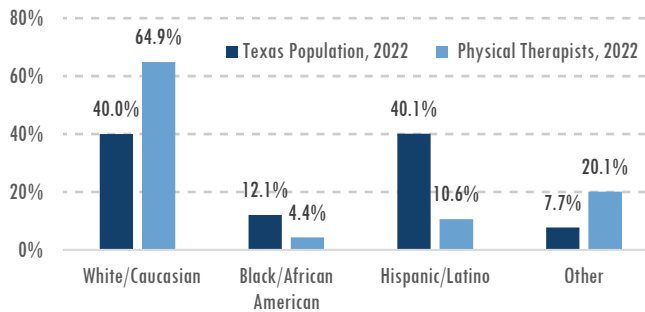

# Demographics of Physical Therapists

## Race/Ethnicity

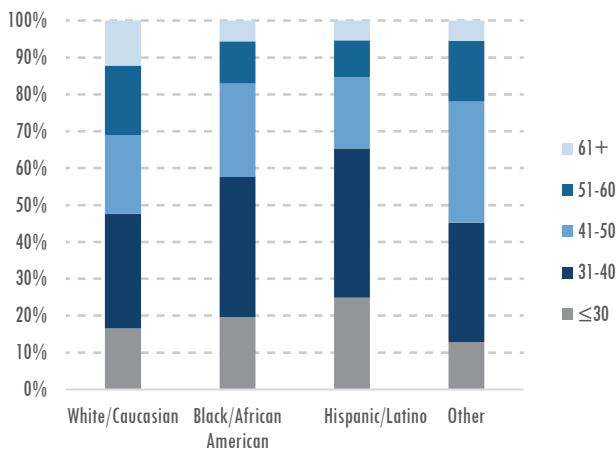
**Figure 4. Race/Ethnicity of Texas Population and Physical Therapists<sup>2</sup>**

Black/African American and Hispanic/Latino physical therapists were underrepresented when compared to the Texas population (Figure 4).<sup>2</sup> Race/ethnicity data were available for 18,377 of 18,378 physical therapists.

## Age Distribution by Race/Ethnicity

- 12.2% of White/Caucasian physical therapists were 61 years of age or over, while 47.6% were aged 40 years or under (Figure 5).
- 25.4% of Black/African American physical therapists were between 41 and 50 years of age, and 57.6% were aged 40 years or under (Figure 5).
- 19.3% of Hispanic/Latino physical therapists were between 41 and 50 years of age, and 65.4% were aged 40 years or under (Figure 5).

## Age

Within 10 years, 17.1% of the current Texas physical therapist workforce will be over 65 years of age.<sup>3</sup>

- 4.3% of active physical therapists in Texas were over 65 years of age in 2022.

## Gender

- In 2022, 67.7% of physical therapists were female and 32.3% were male. Gender data were available for 18,317 of 18,378 physical therapists (99.7%) in 2022.
- In 2012, 70.8% were female and 29.2% were male. Gender data were available for 11,759 of 11,765 physical therapists (99.9%) in 2012.

## Age Distribution by Gender

- Among physical therapists over 55 years of age, males comprised 30.9% of the physical therapist workforce.
- Among physical therapists aged 40 years or under in 2022, 67.8% were female and 32.2% were male.

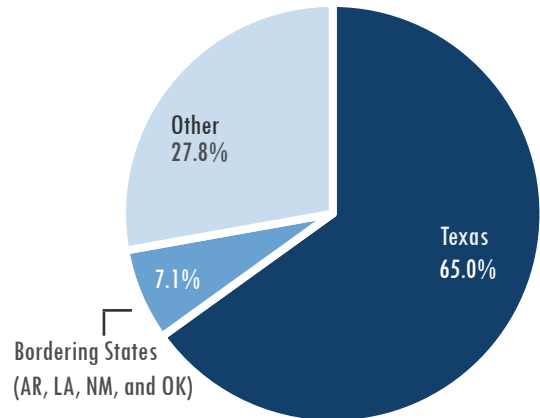

## Education of Physical Therapists

- As seen in Figure 6, 65.0% of physical therapists trained in Texas.
- 7.1% of physical therapists trained in states bordering Texas (Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, and Oklahoma).
- The remaining 27.8% of physical therapists trained in states other than Texas and those bordering Texas.
- Training data were available for 7,422 of 18,378 physical therapists (40.4%).

**Figure 6. Physical Therapist Training by State**



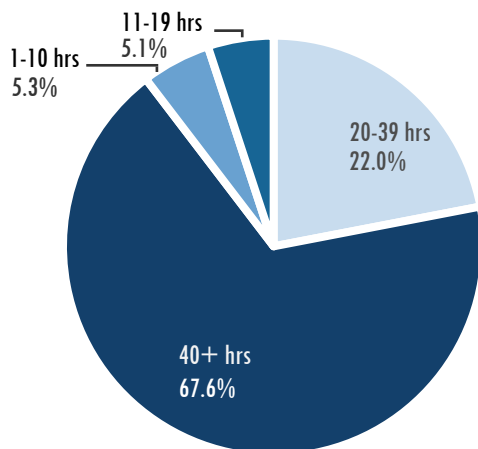
## Employment Characteristics of Physical Therapists

- As seen in Figure 7, majority of physical therapists (67.6%) reported practicing for 40 or more hours.
- Primary practice hours data were available for 12,333 of 18,378 physical therapists (67.1%).
- In 2022, the top three primary specialties for physical therapists were orthopedics (34.0%), geriatrics (28.2%) and an "other" specialty (17.4%).
- Primary specialty data were available for 12,190 of 18,378 physical therapists (66.3%).

- In 2022, the top three primary practice settings for physical therapists were an outpatient clinic or office setting (40.9%), a home health setting (19.2%), and a hospital (critical, intensive, acute, or subacute care) (17.9%).
- Primary practice setting data were available for 14,522 of 18,378 physical therapists (79.0%).
