Examples of Entry-Level Job Postings (with Texas DSHS)

- **Public Health Nurse I**
 - Provide routine public health nursing work in clinical and non-clinical settings for the care and treatment of individuals, families and communities
- **Licensed Vocational Nurse**
 - Provide case management and directly observed therapy/directly observed preventive therapy for the welfare of patients in assigned counties
- **Newborn Screening Nurse**
 - Perform nursing and consultative work for the Newborn Screening Program (NBS); follow-up on infants and children with one or more of the disorders
