

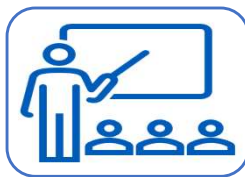

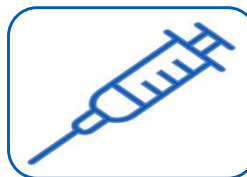

How to Apply

Tips for Success

Examples of Entry Level Jobs in Nursing

Public Health Nurse I

- Provides routine public health nursing work in clinical and non-clinical settings for the assessment, care, and treatment of individuals, families and communities.
- Services are focused on disease prevention such as immunization and comprehensive case management for clients utilizing community resources.

Licensed Vocational Nurse

- Provides case management and directly observed therapy/directly observed preventive therapy for the care, treatment, and general welfare of patient in assigned counties.

Newborn Screening Nurse

- Performs nursing and consultative work for the Newborn Screening Program (NBS).
- Follow-up of infants and children with one or more of the disorders identified by the NBS to coordinate re-testing, evaluation, and treatment.

Community Health Specialist

- Provides administrative supports including referral for services not provided by DSHS, communication with customers and clients about available programs/services, data entry, and monthly reports.
- Provides vaccine management and actively participates in population-based initiatives including public health education program activities.

Interested in next steps? Nursing positions require specific licenses depending on the program. Consider licensures to be a Registered Nurse, Licensed Vocational Nurse, BLS/CPR, and Nurse Aide certifications.
